CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

In this chapter contains an explanation of the Background of Research, Problem Statement, Objective of Research, and Significance of Research.

1.1 Background of Research

Literature is the work imaginative Literature is a means to convey a message about the life of someone to others. Literary as an idea result of writer art that describes the even in human life. Events of life that describe in literature in invention life has made by writer of letters, appear like a reality life. Wallek and Warren (in Kholifah, 2012:1) state that literature represents life in large measure, a social reality, event thought the natural world, and the inner of the subjective world of the individual has also been objected of literary imitation. In reality, the literary work is a medium of communication that involves three components, namely the author as the senders of the message, literature as the message, and the readers as the recipient of the message. Through the process, readers of literary work will be able to catch the message conveyed normally describe the feeling and the main of the researcher base on experience or social circumstances prevailing in the society. The one of kind literary work is a drama, the most popular drama called film.

The film is a work of art that describes moving images with sound. The aim is to present the story with the meaning in a story. In the film, communication used convey message to people. The message of recorded in pictures tell a story made by producers.
